IN THIS ISSUE

During the summer of 1939, Alex N. Dragnich travelled in Europe, chiefly in Yugoslavia. This experience proved valuable during the war when he spent over three years working for the Department of Justice and the Office of Strategic Services as specialist on Yugoslav affairs and Russian policy in the Balkans. Since October, 1945, Mr. Dragnich has been assistant professor of political science at Western Reserve University.

Gabriel A. Almond has only recently returned to his position at Brooklyn College after almost four years of government service. Serving first in the O.W.I. and then in the foreign economic administration, Mr. Almond was sent to Germany in March, 1945. There he directed work in the field of political intelligence. In the near future Mr. Almond expects to complete a collaborative work dealing with Germany's domestic potential. In this connection the Social Science Research Council has granted him an award to continue his studies abroad.

Next month the series on demagogues and people's leaders will be completed with an article on Franklin D. Roosevelt. The series on congressional elections will also end in the June issue with a discussion of the elections of 1910.
