IN THIS ISSUE

ALZADA COMSTOCK, Professor of Economics at Mount Holyoke College, received her A.B. degree from Mount Holyoke in 1910, her M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in 1920 and 1921 at Columbia University. In addition she has completed graduate work at the Chicago School of Civics and Philanthropy, the London School of Economics, the University at Sorbonne. Miss Comstock has taught for many years both at Mount Holyoke College and at Barnard and contributed to numerous publications. She is a Contributing Editor of both *Current History* and the *New International Year Book*.

FREDERICK H. CRAMER, Professor of History at Mount Holyoke College, was born and first educated in Berlin, Germany. He took his degree in 1923 and then embarked on graduate work at Columbia University, Berlin University, Erlangen University and the University at Zurich. For his treatise on the Magna Carta he received his Ph.D. degree in Zurich. In 1937, Mr. Cramer returned to the United States and has since then taught at Mount Holyoke College.

SIDNEY B. FAY is a Professor Emeritus of History at Harvard. His record includes studies at Harvard, the Universities of Paris and Berlin, and honorary degrees from Smith College, and Columbia University. Mr. Fay is author of several books of which the most recent is *The Rise of Brandenburg-Prussia to 1786*, published in 1937. A member of numerous national and international historical societies, Mr. Fay has likewise been a Contributing Editor of *Current History* for many years.

MICHAEL FLORINSKY, a Professor of Economics at Columbia University, was born in Kiev, Russia in 1894 and has studied at the Kiev University Law School, the Michael Arty School in Petrograd, the London School of Economics and King's College, London. He received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Columbia University in 1927 and 1931 respectively. Mr. Florinsky served in the Russian Army in World War I, has studied and taught in this country for many years and is author of several books including *World Revolution and the U.S.S.R.*, published in 1933, and *Toward an Understanding of the U.S.S.R.*, in 1939.

SEYMOUR E. HARRIS, Professor of Economics, received his A.B. and Ph.D. degrees at Harvard in 1920 and 1926 respectively. He has taught at Princeton and Harvard Universities and during the War his experience included work as a member of the Policy Committee of the Board of Economic Warfare (1942), director in the Office of Export-Import Price Control under O.P.A., member of Secretary Hull's committee on Postwar Commercial Policy, member of the Social Science Research Council Committee on control of social data (1943-45). In addition, Mr. Harris has written numerous books of which the most recent is *The National Debt*, published in 1947.

HENRIETTA C. JENNINGS, a Professor of Economics at Wheaton College, Massachusetts, received her A.B. and Ph.D. degrees at Bryn Mawr and has completed graduate studies at the University of Sorbonne and the London School of Economics and Political Science.
