

because it is impartial and detailed it is valuable for reference as well as for general reading. Each month we reprint in full official texts of treaties, agreements and important speeches. Casual reading of the *document section* is not feasible, but it gives students a valuable opportunity to study source material.

CURRENT HISTORY is used extensively for reference and general reading in colleges and universities as well as high schools; it is not "written down" to a "high school level."

The CURRENT HISTORY *Study Plan* is designed to make CURRENT HISTORY material more useful in class discussion. Questions and exercises are outlined to assist the student in following the text; projects are outlined to provide additional study if the teacher feels that this is desirable. As a further aid to the teacher, our education department points out articles that may be particularly difficult as well as those that are easy to follow, and questions on the test are grouped so that those relating to articles not assigned may be omitted.

We know that few teachers have the time to cover in their classrooms all the fields indicated by CURRENT HISTORY each month. Although our *Study Guide* covers each article in detail, we advise the teacher to select for classroom use only such articles as fit into her program at the scholarship level with which she works.

We suggest that you use four or more articles each month for your social studies classes, depending on the amount of time you devote to current affairs. The student should use the Guide to each article as he reads the article. The test may be given later by the teacher. Articles not used in classes on current events may be of considerable value in history, sociology or economics classes. Students should be encouraged to keep their copies for the source material they may find useful later.


