A severely critical review of Grey's conduct of foreign affairs, throwing upon him a large responsibility for the outbreak of the World War.

MORISON, JOHN LYLE. *The Eighth Earl of Elgin, a Chapter in Nineteenth Century Imperial History*. Toronto: Musson Book Company, 1928. \$5.

As Governor General of Canada from 1847 to 1854 and later as High Commissioner in China, Lord Elgin had much to do with the development of British imperial policy.

National Industrial Conference Board. *Employee Stock Purchase Plans in the United States*. New York: The Board, 1928. \$2.50.

An investigation, directed by Margaret L. Stecker, of the participation of labor in the ownership and control of industry through stock purchase.

ODEGARD, PETER. *High-Pressure Politics: the Story of the Anti-Saloon League*. New York: Columbia University Press, 1928. \$3.50.

An unbiased record of one of the most remarkable propaganda organizations in our history.

Lectures by competent authorities on the present economic situation in France, Italy, Czechoslovakia, Russia, Germany and Belgium. An excellent summary.

German industry during the war; how it was organized and how it functioned. A study prepared for the Economic and Social History of the World War, issued by the Carnegie Endowment.


VERNON, H. M. *The Alcohol Problem*. London: Balliere, 1928. 9s.
