ASIA'S LANDS AND PEOPLES

By GEORGE B. CRESSEY, Syracuse University. Second Edition. 615 pages, \$10.50 (text edition available).

A thoroughly revised edition of a work that geographers everywhere have come to regard as the definitive, comprehensive treatment of the physical environment and human problems of Asia, with special emphasis on China, Japan, the entire Soviet Union, and India. Separate chapters or rewritten material deal with such new countries as Korea, Pakistan, Israel, and Indonesia. All of the maps have been revised or redrawn to show new boundaries, and almost 100 new photographs have been included.

LAND OF THE 500 MILLION: A Geography of China

By GEORGE B. CRESSEY. McGraw-Hill Series in Geography. 410 pages, \$10.00 (text edition available).

The most authoritative, up-to-date, and readable book on the subject. As a study in geography, it forms a preface to current political and economic problems. The central focus of the book is "man and his activities" (social, economic, and political); at the same time there is a thorough analysis of the environmental base. The volume ranges over a broad field, from geology and meteorology to economics and geopolitics. It includes an evaluation of potentials under the Communists . . . prospects for the internal development and relations with her neighbors, including the U.S.S.R. Contains excellent new maps and a wealth of fine recent photographs.

EUROPE AND THE MEDITERRANEAN

By NORMAN J. G. POUNDS, Indiana University. McGraw-Hill Series in Geography. 440 pages, \$6.50.

A college text designed to bring to the student the richness and variety of the European continent, the great age of its culture and the roots of its present civilization, deeply buried in the past. It presents Europe and the bordering lands—landscapes, resources, and industries, and man's adaptation to and of the environment. With the interest and intimacy of first-hand observation, the author covers not only the conventional areas of Europe, but areas closely linked politically, culturally and economically with European countries.

SOUTHWEST PACIFIC

By KENNETH B. CUMBERLAND, Auckland University College, New Zealand. 385 pages, \$6.50.

Richly illustrated with maps and photographs, this work will be an invaluable source of information about the territories in the Southwest Pacific. After dealing fully with Australia and New Zealand, the book presents a treatment of the physical and human geography of the associated island territories—the history of the peoples and their economies, the prospects and problems of the wide-flung territories forming the island neighborhoods of the Dominion and the Commonwealth.

ADVANCED ATLAS OF MODERN GEOGRAPHY

By JOHN BARTHOLOMEW, Director, the Geographical Institute, Edinburgh. New Third Edition. 168 pages, \$11.00 (text edition available).

Outstanding for its clarity, precision, workmanship and complete accuracy, this is a truly fine guide to modern geography. Modern in its selection and presentation of maps, it covers the world by regions rather than statistically by country or state. Particular attention is paid to the physiographic features of an area. In addition, it presents world and continental maps giving the salient points on climate, oceanography, ethnography, religion, language, cephalic index, skin color, geology, soils, agricultural regions, vegetation, economic areas, population density, and routes of commerce.
