THE GOVERNMENTS OF LATIN AMERICA

By W. W. PIERSON and FEDERICO G. GIL, University of North Carolina. McGraw-Hill Series in Political Science. 516 pages, \$6.50

An excellent topical and comparative summary of the governments and politics of Latin America. It deals with the forms of organization, functions, and operations of the government of the 20 republics of Latin America, with emphasis on peculiar and indigenous institutions. It gives much space to interpretative data, and special attention to the actual operation, trends, and spirit of government in an effort to explain the underlying causes which account for Latin American political institutions. Much attention is also given to contemporary problems.

AMERICAN CIVILIZATION: A Survey of Its History

By WESLEY M. GEWEHR, DONALD C. GORDON, DAVID S. SPARKS, and ROLAND N. STROMBERG—all at the University of Maryland. McGraw-Hill Series in History. In press

A basic college text with the purpose of pointing up the significant trends, meanings, and interpretations of the nation's history from the colonial times through the Korean War and its aftermath. The approach is radically new, in that the student is carried through the story of American history by means of basic themes around which the narrative is woven. Each chapter is a unit in itself. The editorial group has achieved a homogeneity of style and level.

MODERN PUBLIC OPINION

By WILLIAM ALBIG, University of Illinois. 520 pages, \$6.50

Discusses the psychological processes involved in public opinion; the measurement, recording, and polling of public opinion; the restrictions applied by censorship; and the processes of special pleading and propaganda. Here is a "successor" to the author's widely used PUBLIC OPINION . . . a careful revision and modernization of the older book, in which the basic structure and organization are preserved. Included are sections on each of the mass media: the press, motion pictures, and radio and television.

PUBLIC CONTROL OF ECONOMIC ENTERPRISE

By HAROLD D. KOONTZ, University of California, and RICHARD W. GABLE, University of Southern California. 830 pages, \$7.00

A comprehensive statement of the problems that have given rise to government economic controls . . . reviews the nature of and the experience under economic controls . . . and evaluates these controls. All major areas of the economy which have experienced government aid, assistance, or regulation are covered. In addition to the comprehensive and detailed treatment of government control of economic activity, the book treats government aid to business, government ownership, and public control of the total economy.
