## **AMERICAN CIVILIZATION: A Survey of Its History**

By WESLEY M. GEWEHR, DONALD C. GORDON, DAVID S. SPARKS, and ROLAND N. STROMBERG—all at the University of Maryland. *McGraw-Hill Series in History*. 664 pages, \$6.75

A basic college text with the purpose of pointing up the significant trends, meanings, and interpretations of the nation's history from the colonial times through the Korean War and its aftermath. The approach is radically new, in that the student is carried through the story of American history by means of basic themes around which the narrative is woven. Each chapter is a unit in itself. The editorial group has achieved a homogeneity of style and level.

## **MIGHTY STONEWALL**

By FRANK E. VANDIVER, Rice Institute. 560 pages, \$6.50

A magnificent, detailed, and exciting biography of Stonewall Jackson, one of America's few authentic military geniuses. As a military genius, he has been rated by some on a par with Napoleon, while his deep religious faith has caused others to compare him with Cromwell. Professor Vandiver offers a complete and definitive picture of Jackson, the man and the general—a picture drawn with passion, excitement, and scrupulous scholarship.

## **MILITARY HERITAGE OF AMERICA**

By R. ERNEST DUPUY, Colonel, U. S. A., Ret., and TREVOR N. DUPUY, Chief of Staff Office, Dept. of the Army. *McGraw-Hill Series in History*. 784 pages, \$10.00 (text edition available)

A comprehensive history of American military strategy and tactics which combines analysis and description with readings from major military figures and military historians. Beginning with the colonial wars of the 18th Century, it covers American military history through the Korean War. It is the first American Military History text since 1937. Particular stress is laid on modern wars. The relationship of economic, political, and social factors to wars and military operations emphasized throughout. Includes 130 maps.
