*In his capacity as economic and political analyst, Henry Simon Bloch has appeared on several national radio programs dealing with European affairs. He is also a contributor to scholarly and popular journals and co-author of the book, Economics of Military Occupation, published by the University of Chicago Press.*

*His pre-Hitler newspaper experience in Germany, gives Felix E. Hirsch of Bard College an ample background for his discussion of the German press, now and then. He was an editor for the Acht-Uhr Abendblatt and Berliner Tageblatt before he fled the Nazis.*
